### Second Bulgarian Empire (1186–1396)

- 29 documents
- 20 documents emanating from the imperial chancery
- 10 Cyrillic imperial documents
- 1 forgery (Cyrillic charter of Tsar Ioan Kaliman)











### **Dispersion of Bulgarian Diplomatic Material**

- Vatican archives: 11 documents
- Mount Athos: 8 documents (Zograf 4, Vatoped 2, Hilandar 2)
- Constantinople: 3 documents
- Venetian archives: 2 documents
- St. Petersburg, Dubrovnik, Genoa, Brashov, Bulgaria: one document each











#### **Document Issuers**

- Chancery of Tsar Kaloyan: 10 documents (including five issued by Archbishop Basil)
- Ioan Alexander: 7 documents (Greek 3, Latin 2, Slavic 2)
- loan Asen II, loan Šišman: two documents each
- Belota, Alexis Slav, Michael Asen, Constantine
   Tich, Ivanko, Ioan Sracimir: one document each
- Two undisputed 16th century forgeries made in Zograf monastery











### **Document Language**

Latin: 14 documents (-11)\*

Slavic: 11 documents (+11)\*

Greek: four documents

\* 11 documents from the correspondence with Pope Innocent III were first translated from Bulgarian to Greek, and then from Greek to Latin.











### **Chronological Distribution of Documents**

- 14 documents from the first 50 years of existence of the Second Bulgarian Empire (up to 1230)
- 11 documents from the last 50 years of medieval Bulgarian state (1342–1396)
- Two documents for the period 1231–1341
- Two forged documents (most probably) from the 16th century











### **State of Preservation and Diplomatic Status**

- 17 documents preserved as copies in archival registries and monastic cartularies
- Five documents separately preserved on paper (originals 3, contemporary copy 1, later interpolated copy 1)
- Seven documents separately preserved on parchment (forgeries 2, originals 3, copy? 1)











# Formalized Date as Main Identifier of Documents

**Examples 1:** 

- 1347-12-01\_loan\_Alexander
- = charter was issued by Tsar Ioan Alexander on December 1st 1347
- •1204-10-15\_tpq\_Kaloyan
- = charter was issued by Tsar Kaloyan after October 15th 1204
- 1203\_09\_01\_byz\_Archbishop\_Basil
- = charter was issued between Sept 1st 1203 and Aug 31st 1204











# Formalized Date as Main Identifier of Documents

**Examples 2:** 

missing date elements are replaced by letter X:

1342-03-xx\_loan\_Alexander = charter from March 1342

uncertain year marked with ?

1230-04-xx\_?\_loan\_Asen\_II \_ = issued in April, probably 1230

copies marked by letters A, B, C, etc.

1352-10-04\_loan\_Alexander\_B = copy B of document issued by loan Alexander on October 10, 1352











# Presentation Format of Bulgarian Documents on Monasterium.net

- >date and place of issuing
- > short abstract
- original date from document
- > seal description and seal owner
- material, dimensions, possible damages
- place of keeping
- > tradition (original, copy, transumpt, forgery, fragment)
- > other copies
- > editions
- > languague
- > images









## **Most Important Tasks in Future**

- Providing full text transcriptions (digital editions)
- Acquiring quality (high-resolution color) images











### **Problem of Images**

- No images for seven documents
- 22 documents are represented by images of various quality
  - > quality color images for only two documents
  - ➢ four documents with good black and white images that will soon be replaced by color images
  - Five black and white images hopefully to be replaced by color counterparts in due time
  - ➤ 11 documents from the Vatican can only be published if a substantial sum of money is paid for copyright permission
